We're delighted to bring this 1940s classic back to the PG Players stage after a ten year hiatus! It's an honor to play with a cast of such talented, creative, and invested actors! They've been an absolute joy to work with, and we thank them from the bottom of our hearts!

See How They Run opened in 1944 at the Peterborough Rep Theater in England, and shortly after, toured to entertain the British troops. It had continual revivals during war time—during which the story is told that, on West End's opening night, three 'doodlebugs' (V-1 flying bombs) exploded near the theater. No-one budged until after the performance had ended, but at the cast party, the actor playing Clive complained that all three went off just as he was delivering his funniest lines!

We want to assure you that we don't anticipate that kind of interruption during our performance, but we do hope to keep you on the edge of your seat as you keep up with this zany bunch of characters and... see how they run!
